It's my immense pleasure to present the annual report 2021-22 on behalf of our board members and PakAID team. The report is based on PakAID diversified interventions in humanitarian and development sectors during the year 2021-22.

PakAID undertook emergency response of Winterized Kits for affected people of Mansehra, Abbottabad, Lahore and Chakwal. In addition to this Relief food packs were distributed among the earthquake-affected people of Baluchistan and among the war victims in Beirut. PakAID mainly focuses on rapid humanitarian interventions and long-term development Programs to build self-sustained and resilient communities' hence enabling people to live their life with dignity and grace.

Besides emergency response, the Year 2022 witnessed us working on long-term development Programmes in core thematic areas of WASH and Integrated Development Initiatives. Our seasonal support program enables us to share the Blessings of Islamic festivities with the poorest segment of our society. "Ramadan Food Pack Distribution" and "Qurbani Programme" not only brought smiles to the faces of neglected communities but also ease their sufferings during these Islamic occasions and contribute to addressing the malnutrition issues.

We have also started our health support program, facilitating marginalized and the most deprived communities of remote areas of Tehsil Gujjar Khan, District Rawalpindi in collaboration with Punjab Health Department. This health support program comprises both preventive and curative measures.

We strongly believe that we can lead to positive change in society only through dedication, commitment, and selflessness while working for downtrodden communities with a participatory approach. Our strong M&E mechanism enables our team to monitor the long-lasting impact of project interventions and assure the quality of services for target communities and make ways for sustainable development and uplift of marginalized families.

I acknowledge the efforts of my team in the completion of four years of services in Pakistan since December 2018. I would like to thank our donors for their trust, support and lending hands to reach the unreached, and special thanks to our Trustees for sharing their vision, continuous guidance, support and facilitation for the effective execution of our Programs. I expand my gratitude to the government of Pakistan for providing their continued support, guidance and facilitation for the implementation of program activities.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Pakistan has been one of the most vulnerable countries in terms of its economic crises, political instability, poverty and climate change. These factors have multiplier effects on the people of Pakistan since many of them do not have stable incomes and measures must be taken to overcome those. Moreover, the 17 SDGs identified by the UN must also be achieved before 2030 to take Pakistan out of crisis. For these and many more reasons, PakAID has been and will be doing its part to bring about this change.

We delivered humanitarian assistance, worth GBP 2.07 million in 2021-22 for the betterment of the society and Pakistan overall in various ways. It is an immense pleasure to say that we delivered humanitarian assistance, worth GBP 2.07 million in 2021-22 reaching 220,161 people in Pakistan (Ref-Graph:1.1). Our outreach areas were Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Punjab, Baluchistan, Sindh, Gilgit Baltistan & Azad Jammu & Kashmir. We covered a total of 45 districts where we implemented 14 projects with 23,039 interventions overall.

Specifically PakAID's Emergency response has benefitted a total of 10,619 individuals in terms of providing them with food packs and winter kits. Totally 1517 interventions were done in this specific thematic area.

In the WASH sector, around 65,755 beneficiaries were benefited from 4,682 interventions done this year. These interventions include hand pumps, water wells, dug wells, solar water wells and filtration plants. WASH has been the core working area in which our team has been actively involved and continues to deliver their best in every big and small project. Like the previous years this year also PakAID actively participated in extending its Religious Dues towards the society's vulnerable and marginalized during Ramadan and Eid al Adha. PakAID provided relief this Ramadan by distributing 3,649 Ramadan Food Packs in major districts

benefiting almost around 25,543 people. In the Qurbani Programme 2022, around 12,850 families i.e. almost 89,950 individuals were benefited through the distribution of fresh meat packs in all the major districts of Pakistan including Azad Jammu and Kashmir.

Last but not the least; PakAID has intervened in the sector of Education where it aims to restructure 5 schools in the district of Southern Punjab. It is expected that by the end of the annual year 2023, more than 1000 students would have been benefited with the interventions. This will have a multiplier effect on the student and society. And PakAID hopes that the Education program will also spread to the nearby villages of Southern Punjab and parts of Pakistan in near future.

PakAID under its health support program initiative facilitated marginalized and most deprived communities of remote areas of Tehsil Gujjar Khan, District Rawalpindi and Tehsil, Sohawa, Dina and Jehlum, District Jehlum with collaborative effort of Health Department of Punjab. This health support program comprises of both preventive and curative measures. Preventive measures include vaccination program of health department that is basically on Covid-19, measles rubella and polio vaccinations. A total number of 14058 patients were facilitated by said services including 9222 female and 4836 male. Mother and child health is utmost priority of PakAID therefore more than 1378 mothers were facilitated through free ultrasound and sugar testing (details in Activity/Delivery Table). Furthermore, this short report depicts about the graphical representation of 57 free medical camps data in proceedings facilitated so far.

With all these projects done, we hope that in the annual year 2021-22, we will have done more projects, will have reached out to more people and will play a bigger role in making Pakistan a better country to live in.

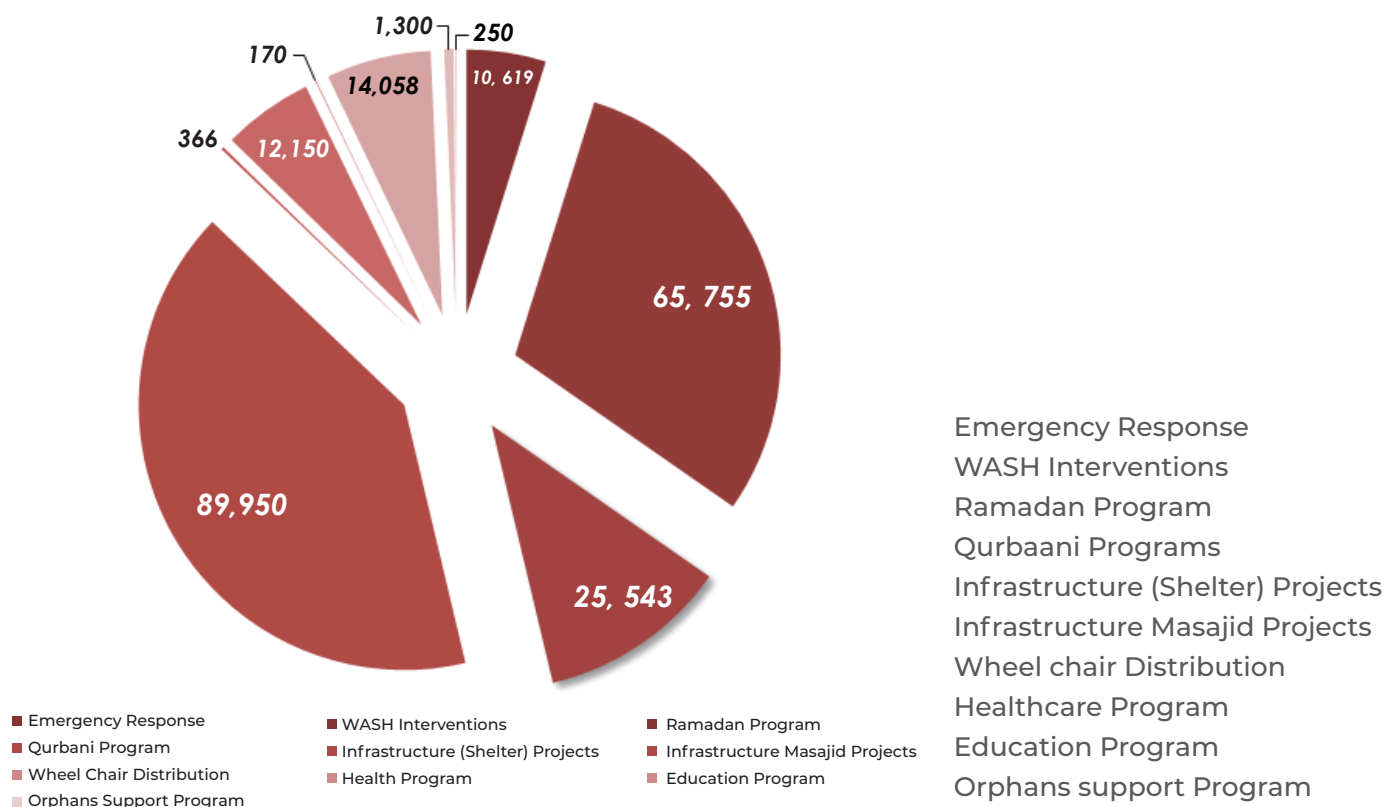

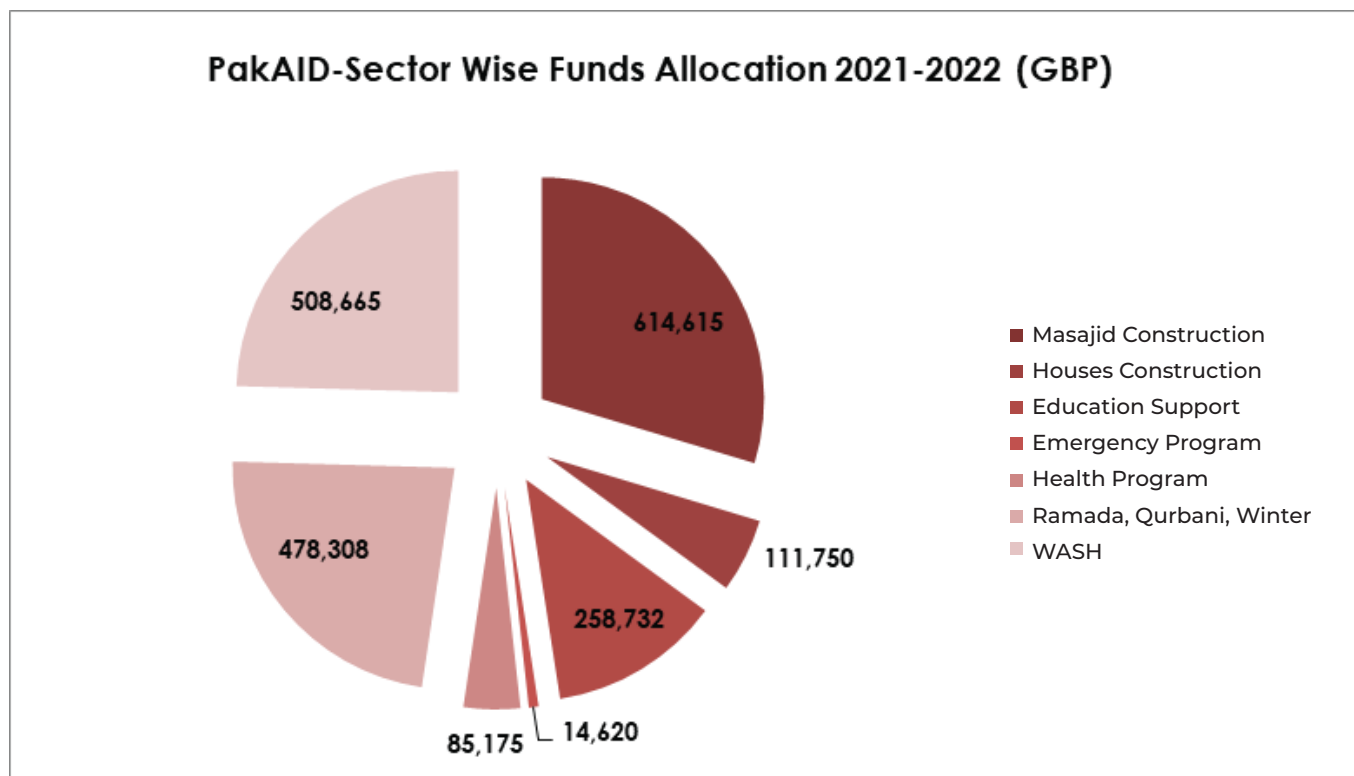

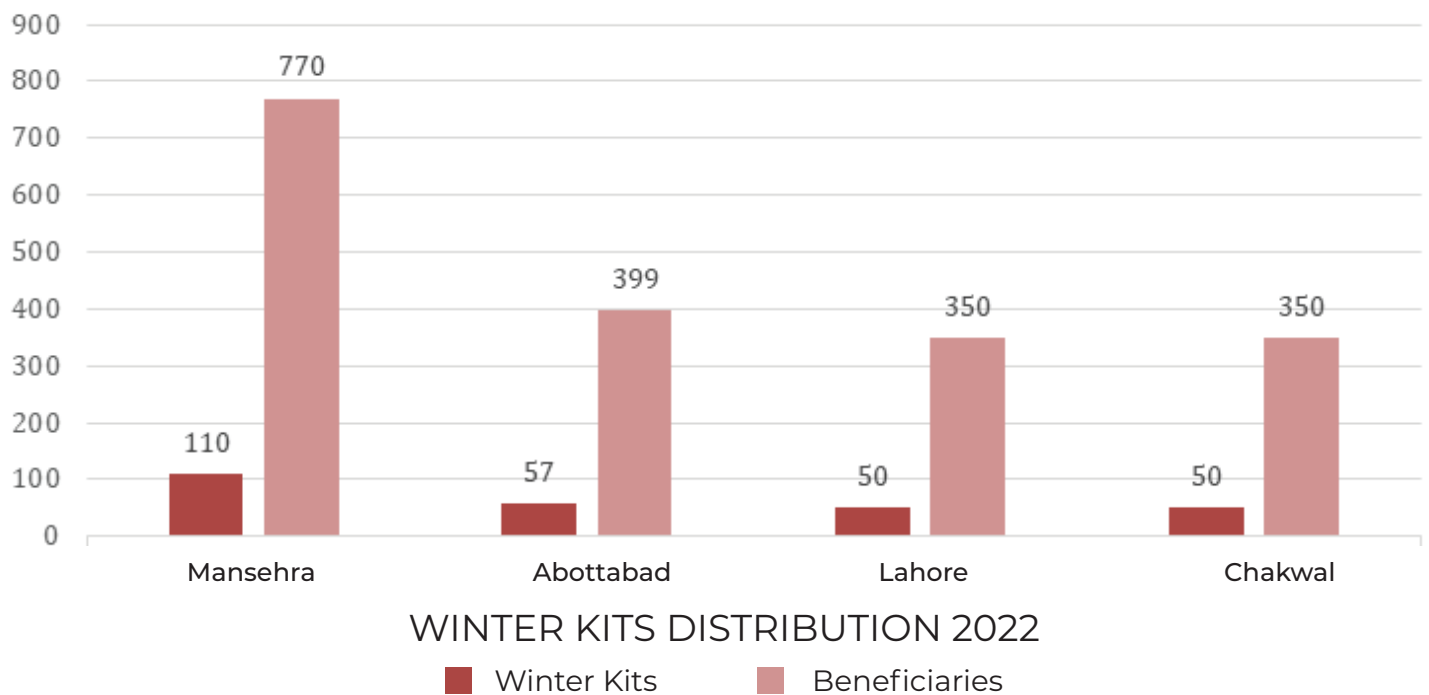


EMERGENCY RESPONSE

Summary

PakAID's goal was to supply, to the most vulnerable families in Pakistan especially women and children, enough winter supplies including bedding and warm clothing. The impact of this provision was to reduce the suffering caused by the harsh winters and protect them from illnesses minimizing their health issues. A total 1869 beneficiaries were facilitated through 267 interventions in 4 districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Punjab Provinces, Graph-1.2

Relief operation was performed by PakAid Team in District Harnai; Baluchistan province in response to a 5.9 magnitude Earthquake. 250 food packs were distributed among the victims' facilitating 1750 individuals. PakAid also distributed 1000 Relief Food Packs among the war victims in Lebanon.

Impacts of the Program

Majority of the economically vulnerable people in Pakistan do not have essential NFI's to cope with the harsh and chill weather in the winters. The current pandemic has severely affected the daily wage labourers and other small household businesses entrepreneurs especially widows and orphans, but through our Emergency Response Programme; Provision of Winterized kits; those who were economically vulnerable had quilts and blankets at the start of the winter season. With this the number of people getting affected by seasonal illnesses was greatly reduced and health improved generally.

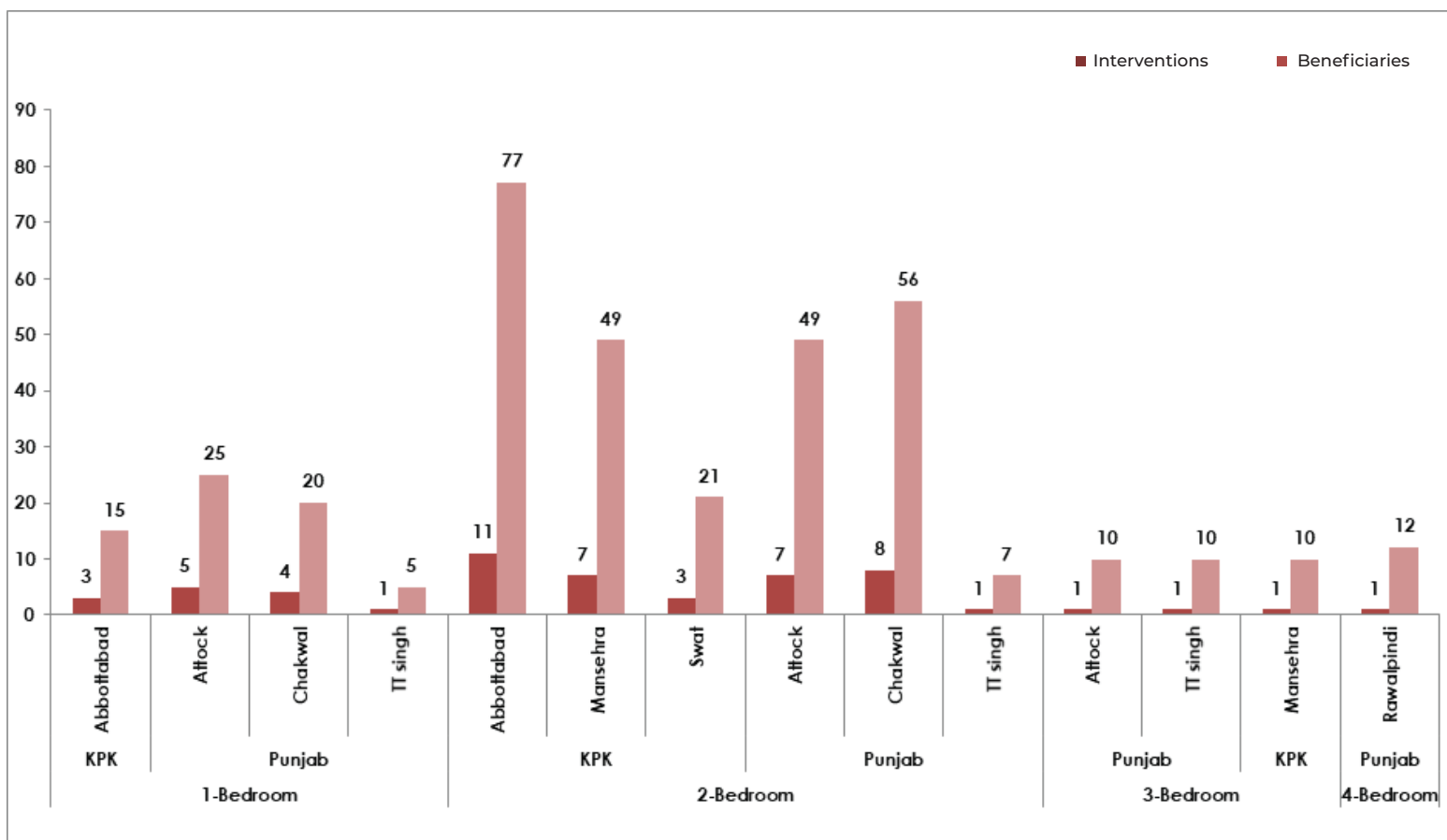
SHELTER & CONSTRUCTION

Summary

Shelter or your own house gives you a sense of security and being safe. It protects you from the severe hot or cold weather conditions and other social evils. We realize that it is often difficult for women with children, who have lost their husbands, to feed their family as well as keep their house in good condition. PakAID supports vulnerable families with dignity and care. We protect widows, orphans and homeless by providing shelter houses; own house gives you a sense of security and safety. We are empowering women, and working to give children a brighter, happier future. Therefore, PakAID constructed 54 houses and facilitated 366 beneficiaries. (Graph-1.3)

Impacts of Program Shelter:

Vulnerable families were supported with dignity and care. Widows, orphans and homeless were provided with shelter houses. This provision gave them a sense of security and safety. We empowered the marginalized women and orphan children through building shelter homes to give children a brighter, safer and happier future.

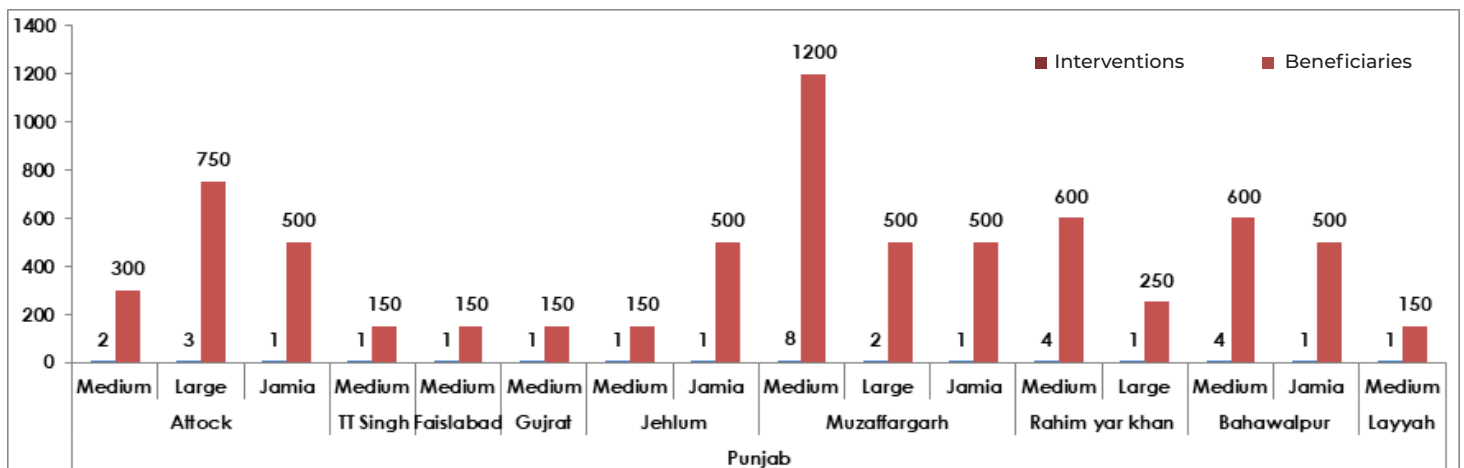

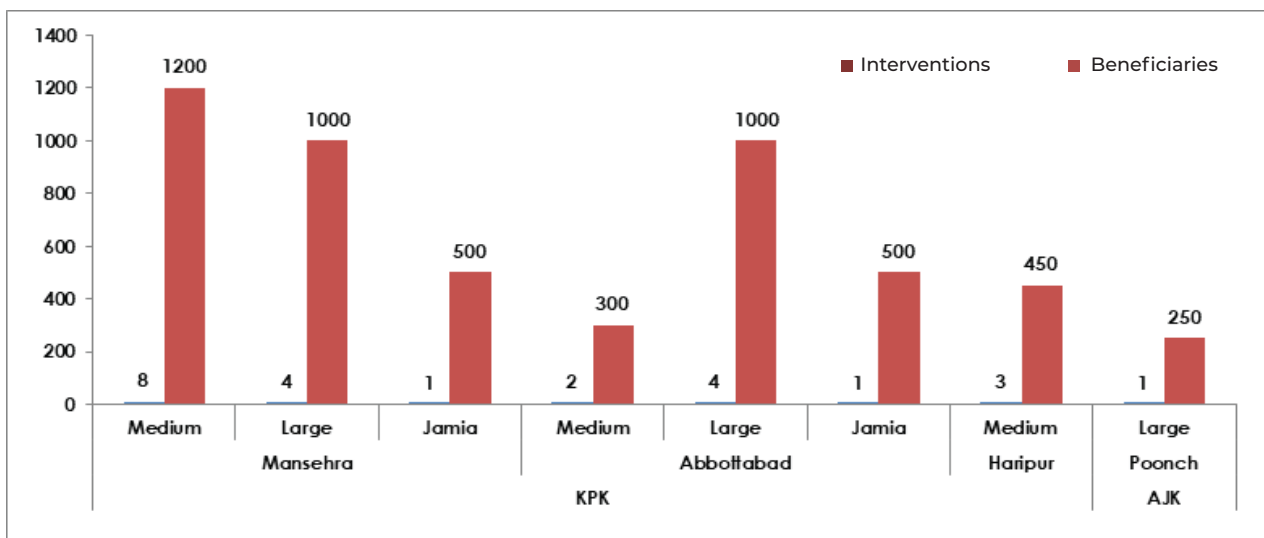

Mosques are the centre of any community where people can congregate for their five daily prayers and Friday congregation sermons. A mosque serves as a place where Muslims can come together not only for prayers, but for information, education and meetings. Since the areas we worked in were remote they did not have access to even building a Masjid for them. PakAID went to their assistance and successfully built 57 Masajid of medium, large, and jamia levels and benefited 12150 individuals (graph 1.4 & 1.5) in different communities so the people can pray and perform their religious dues. 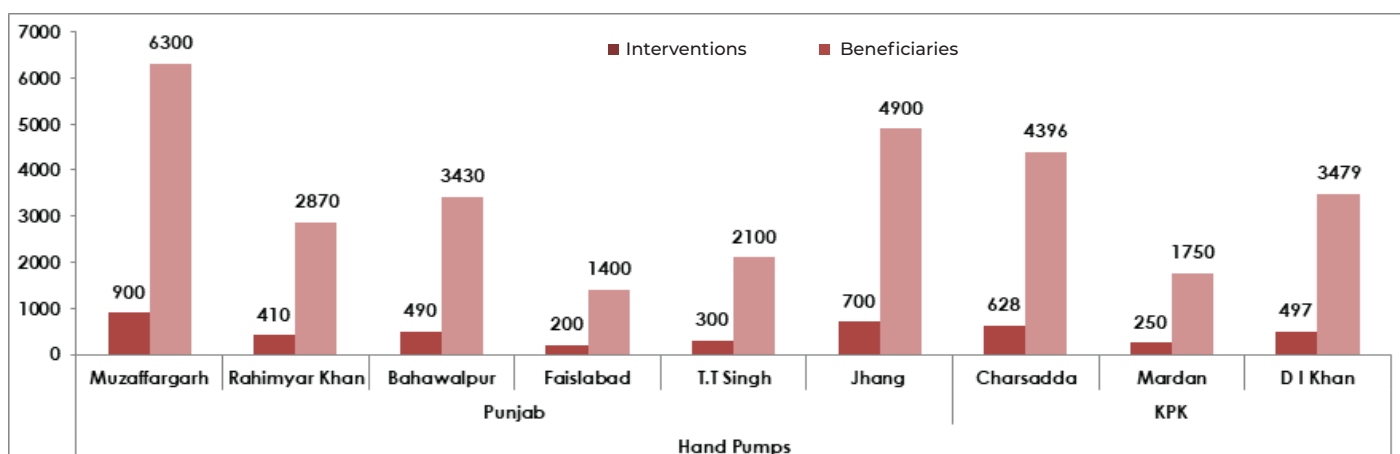

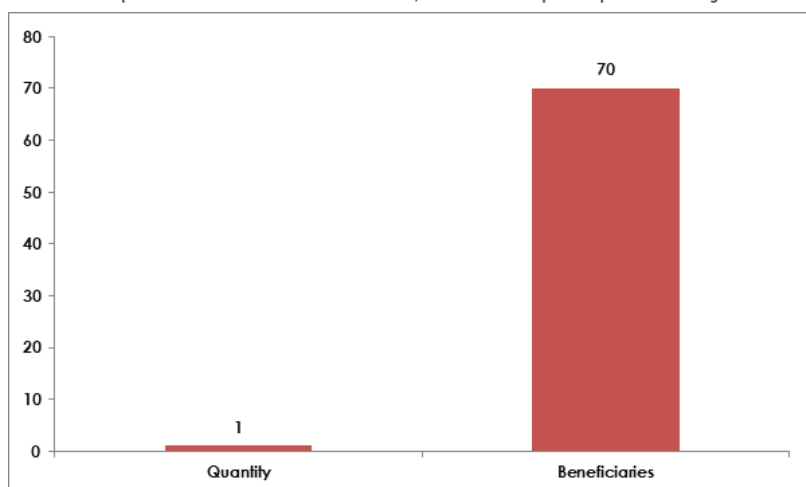

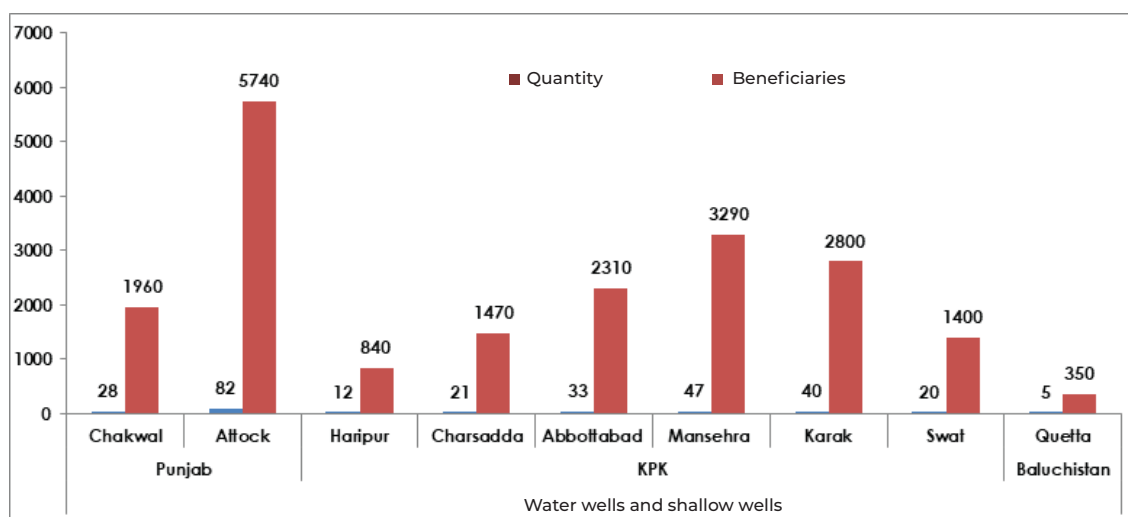
PakAID successfully provide improvement in access to clean drinking water through the installation and construction of hand pumps (4,375, graph-1.6), Indus hand pumps (1, graph-1.7), water wells (288, graph-1.8), solar water wells (14, graph-1.9), and water filtration plants (5, graph-1.10) in major districts of Pakistan; having a positive impact on the community's education, health, economics, and women empowerment. 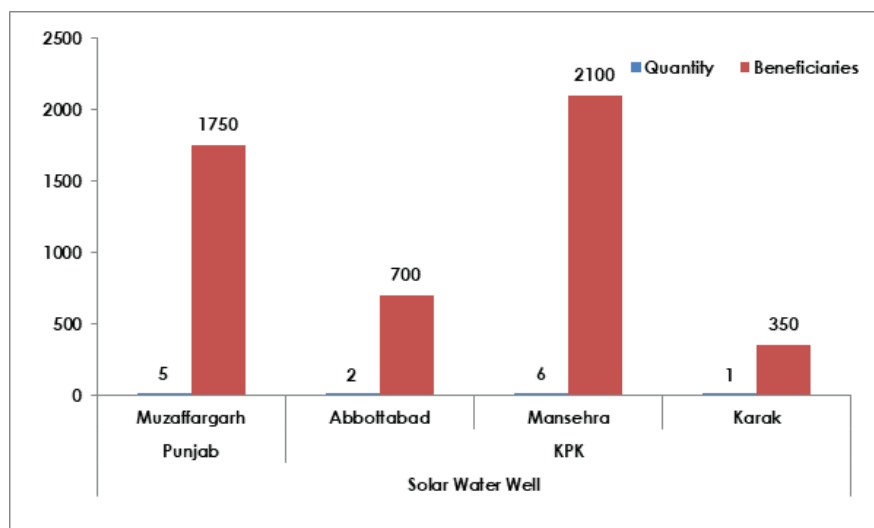
Graph-1.6: Construction of 4,375 Hand pumps in Punjab & Khyber Pakhtunkhwa for 30,625 Beneficiaries



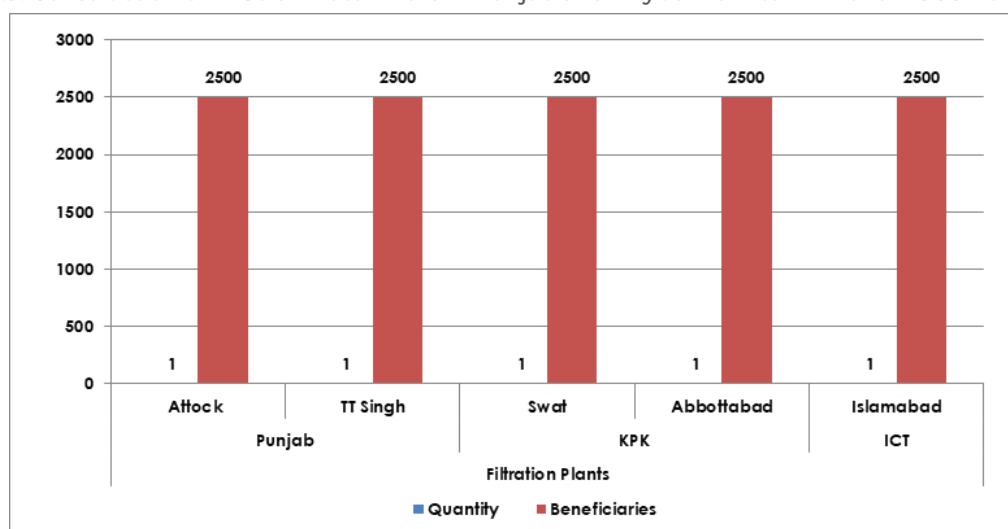

Impacts of the Program

Based on our multiple visits to the region, we believe that the key to pulling the villagers out of generational poverty is to provide them with clean drinking water. This has enabled the villagers to succeed in other areas of their lives such as education and economic freedom. The biggest benefit of having a these WASH interventions is that they provides clean drinking water that does not have any contaminants. This has drastically reduced the chance for the villagers to contact any water-related diseases. These projects have a profound impact on local communities which are as follows:

- 1. No Manual Labor:** Open Dug Wells require villagers to pull the water for up to hundreds of yards before the bucket of water reaches the surface. The time spent pulling on the manual labor hinders villagers from doing other life-essential tasks such as growing crops or going to school. With solar well, all that's required to retrieve water is to twist a knob. It's that simple. Each Solar Well comes with taps to allow for multiple villagers to get clean drinking water at once. No ropes or pulleys required.
- 2. Water That Lasts:** Solar Wells are closed systems that use electrical energy to pull water from deep within the ground. Because there is electrical energy, rather than manual labor, the motor is able to pull water much faster and deeper than it could be pulled through a rope and bucket. This allows the Solar Wells to last an estimated 25 years.

3. Contamination Free Water: Open Dug Wells are open from the top (no lid), which leaves them exposed to contaminants such as dirt and livestock. It's very common for livestock to fall into the wells overnight thus fully contaminating the water supply until the dead animal is retrieved from the well and the well is flushed out. Solar wells are closed for the top, preventing contaminations.

4. Improve Personal Health: The project has improved the health status of the community in the targeted localities and reduced the level of illnesses and deaths caused by waterborne diseases like typhoid, worms, cholera, dysentery, and diarrhea.

5. Access to Education: Availability of clean water has enabled women and children to attend school more attentively as now they do not have to focus on access to clean drinking water and come to class hydrated and ready to learn. This will lead to an increased literacy rate and social development.

6. Prosperity for Women: Since now women do not have to spend the whole day carrying water for miles, they get ample time to do other productive household and social activities, find more time to care for their families, expand minimal farming to sustainable levels, and even run small businesses thus bringing women one step closer to economic freedom.

7. Enhance Productivity and Reduction in Poverty: One of the greatest causes of poverty in developing countries like Pakistan is the lack of access to clean drinking water. The lack of water is an often insurmountable obstacle to helping oneself. Food can't be grown, houses can't be built, a healthy lifestyle can't be maintained, education is not possible and hence it is almost impossible to do any productive work. Without clean water, the possibility of breaking out of the cycle of poverty is incredibly slim. When a water solution is put into place, sustainable agriculture is possible. Children get back to school instead of collecting dirty water all day, or being sick from waterborne illnesses. Parents find more time to care for their families, expand minimal farming to sustainable levels, and even run small businesses; hence communities are freed to begin working themselves out of poverty.

8. Reduce Plastic Waste: If people choose to buy bottled water rather than drink from the tap, they are adding to the pollution of the earth by filling up landfills with the plastic bottles. The plastic used in water bottles is neither good for the planet or for the health. They often contain BPA, which leaks into the water people end up drinking. The water treatment system has eliminated this problem by providing clean water straight from the tap.



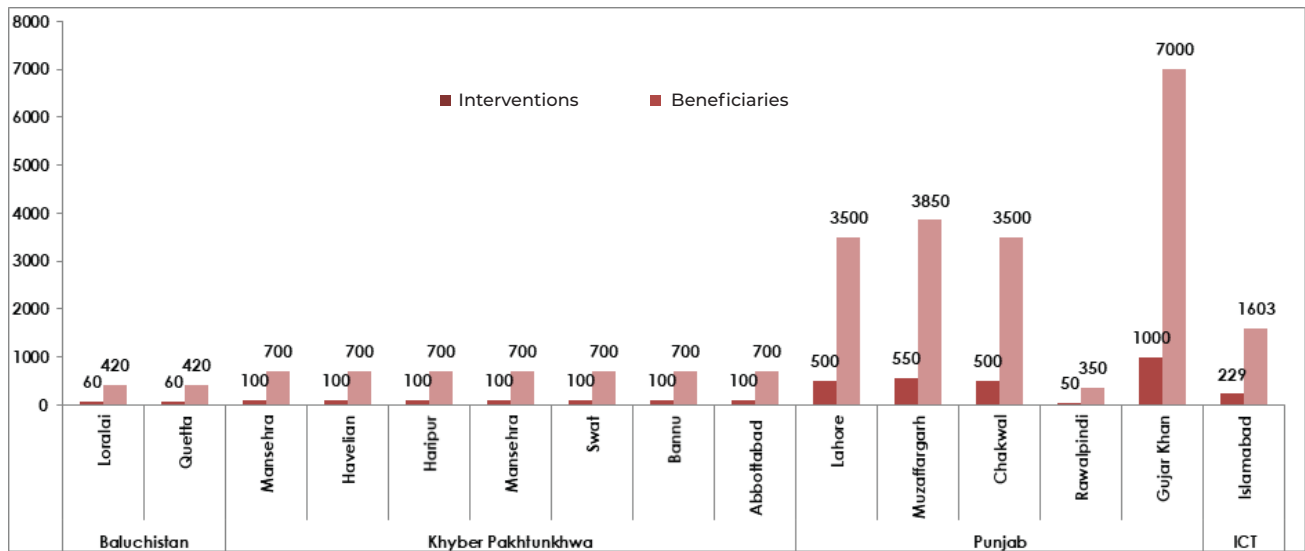

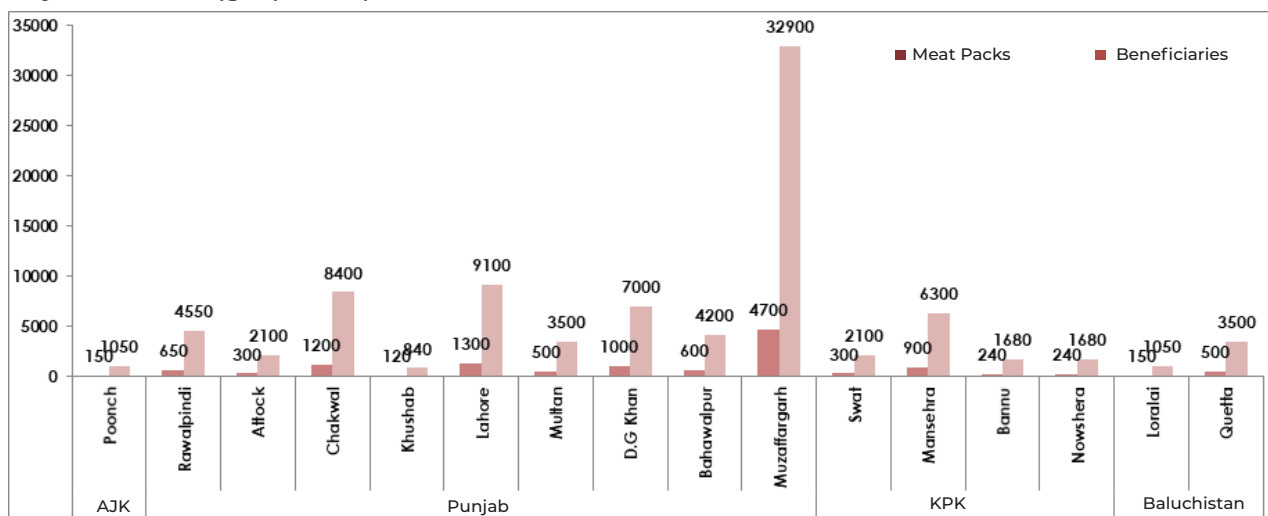
Summary

Ramadan Food Packs: This Ramadan, PakAID provided food parcels containing essential items such as oil, flour, lentils and dates to families in need. The needy Families reached out across Pakistan are mostly those of the widows, orphans, elderly, daily wages labourers and small farmers. The Ramadan food baskets allowed them to be better prepared for the month of Ramadan, easing their worries about where their next meal would come from. A total of 3,649 food packages were distributed in Kyber Pakhtunkhwa, Baluchistan, Punjab and Islamabad Capital Territory by covering 15 districts and benefiting 25,543 individuals. Qurbani Programme: PakAID team reached out to the needy and delivered them meat packs in a respectful way. Sacrificial animals were purchased from local suppliers in order to benefit the local economy and slaughtered according to Sharia. Fresh meat was packed and then distributed among the needy and deserving families at different locations all across the country. Each meat packet contained on average of 2.5 to 3 kilograms of meat, which provided a family of 7 with meals for about a week. In qurbani program-2022, a total of 89,950 individuals were directly benefited (graph-1.12).

Impacts of Program

1. Ramadan provided food security for thousands of families in need across Pakistan during Ramadan. Already struggling to survive, their needs are accentuated during this blessed month when they might not have even basic foodstuffs for suhoor and iftar. Our support enabled the poorest and most vulnerable to share the blessings of this precious month by having sufficient nutrition and by not having to worry about opening or closing their daily fast with. The deprived and helpless people stormed to our distribution points in hope to get something to feed their families.

This project enabled us to provide 3,649 food baskets, this Ramadan, in different villages of Pakistan. In this project, 3,649 families i.e. 25,543 individuals (Annex-4) have been blessed in the holy month of Ramadan. For list of food items (Annex-6)



2. Qurbani is a sacrifice that is offered at the time of Eid al-Adha to show gratitude towards Allah and to provide for the poor and needy. Keeping the original spirit of Qurbani fi SabilAllah in due consideration, PakAID Pakistan commemorated this Islamic ritual with traditional zeal and enthusiasm. Those who received the Qurbani meat included widowed women, orphaned children, refugees and poor, elderly or disabled people. For the majority of these people, meat is not part of their regular diet. The Qurbani meat allows some families to eat meat after a whole year. When families receive Qurbani meat, it fostered a real sense of hope for them and allowed them to celebrate this important occasion along with millions of other Muslims across the world. In 2022, almost 12,850 families i.e. for a family of 7 on an average almost 89,950 individuals were benefited from this project. Annex-5

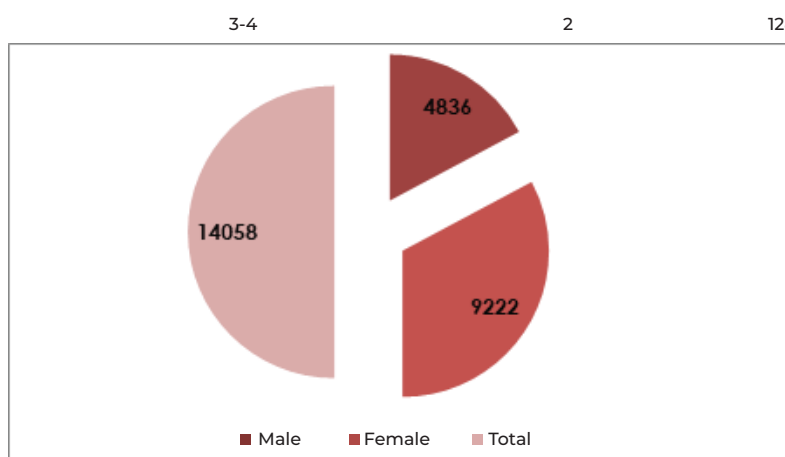

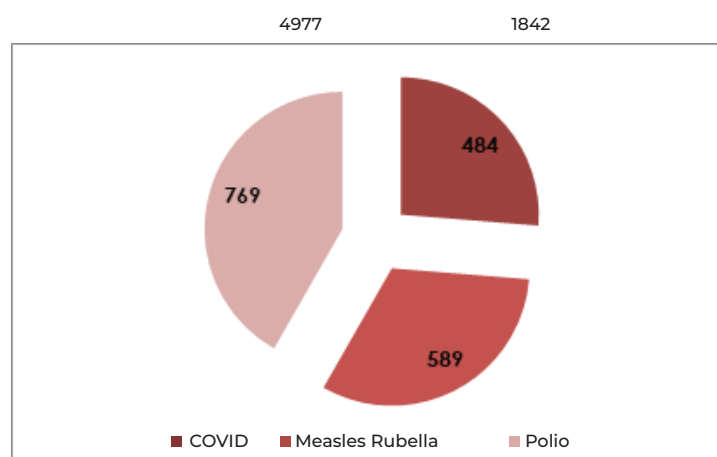
PakAID under its health support program initiative facilitated marginalized and most deprived communities of remote areas of Tehsil Gujjar Khan, District Rawalpindi and Tehsil, Sohawa, Dina and Jehlum, District Jehlum with collaborative effort of Health Department of Punjab. This health support program comprises of both preventive and curative measures. Preventive measures include vaccination program of health department that is basically on Covid-19, measles rubella and polio vaccinations. A total number of 1842 individuals including men, women, children and elders were vaccinated in 57 camps. Moreover, on curative measures PakAID provided free medical facilities for vulnerable communities at their door step by providing free pick and drop service through free ambulance service, free medical checkups from specialized doctors, free medicines as per need and recommendations of doctors and free test as prescribed by doctor's teams. A total number of 14058 patients were facilitated by said services including 9222 female and 4836 male. Mother and child health is utmost priority of PakAID therefore more than 1378 mothers were facilitated through free ultrasound and sugar testing (details in Activity/Delivery Table). Furthermore, this short report depicts about the graphical representation of 57 free medical camps data in proceedings facilitated so far. As an achievement and improvement in data management system PakAID team conceptualized and developed Management Information System (MIS) for storage and real time reflection of progress.

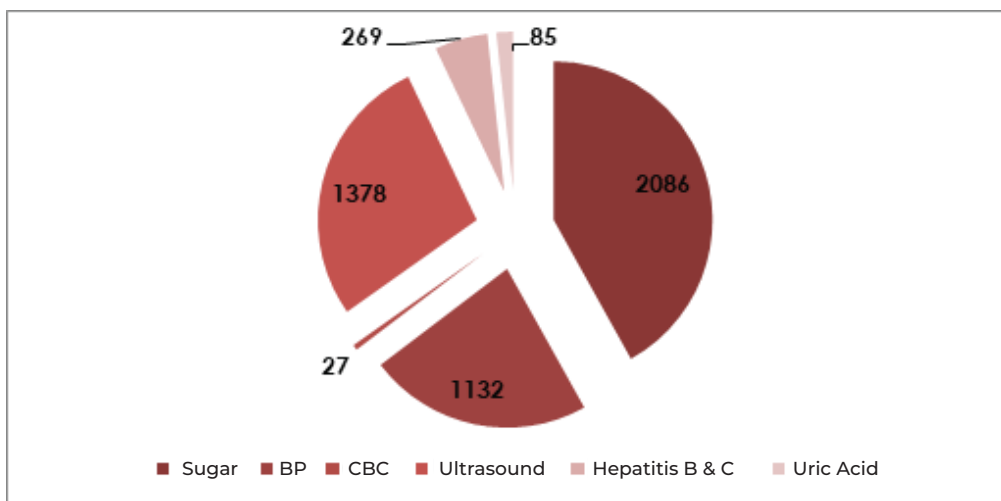

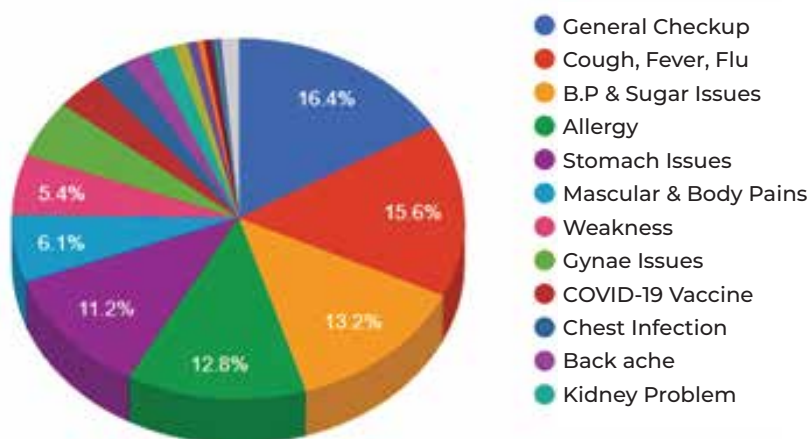
Graph-1.13: Details for Patient facilitation: A total of 14058 individuals were facilitated till date and it includes 9222 female and 4836 male

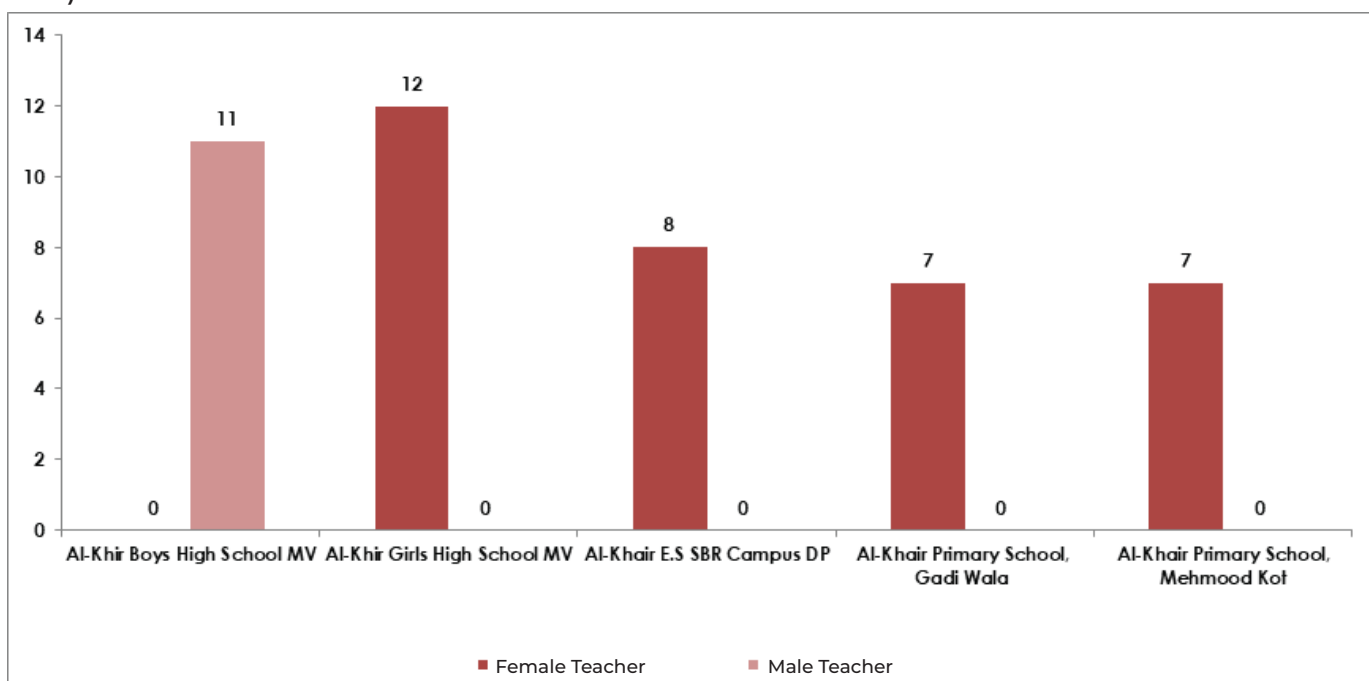

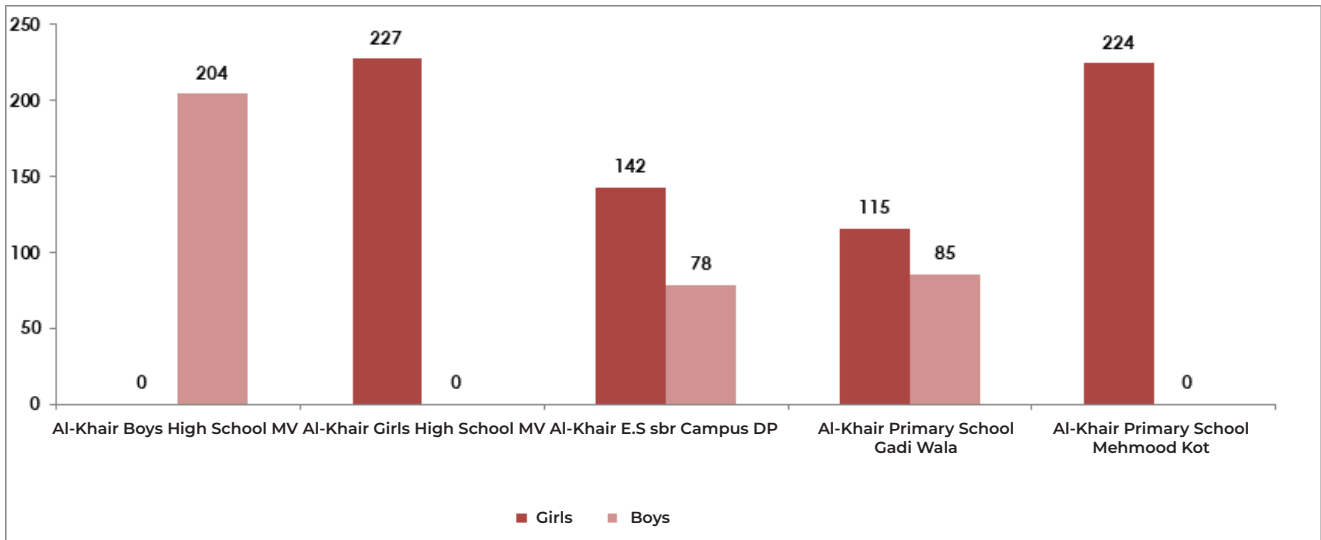
PakAID has adopted 5 schools in the Southern Punjab region and is constantly working for its face lift and up gradation. As of year 2021, PakAID has done a gap analysis where it identified the existing loopholes in the schools. It has also identified that renovation of schools is of utmost importance as it develops interest of the students as well as teachers. Moreover, PakAID is working to provide the students with the basic school supplies like furniture, uniform, stationery, and books. For the teachers, we are having training programs in order to fully equip them with skills they need in order to teach children in classroom setting. Other than this, we are revisiting their academics and working on strategies to make children study in a fun and friendly environment.

PakAID has also been involved in facilitating the teachers and staff in monetary terms. And thus, we have created jobs for the underprivileged through these measures. Hence, they do not have to leave their homes in order to work. This has facilitated them enough since their travel and living expense is saved which was previously not an option.

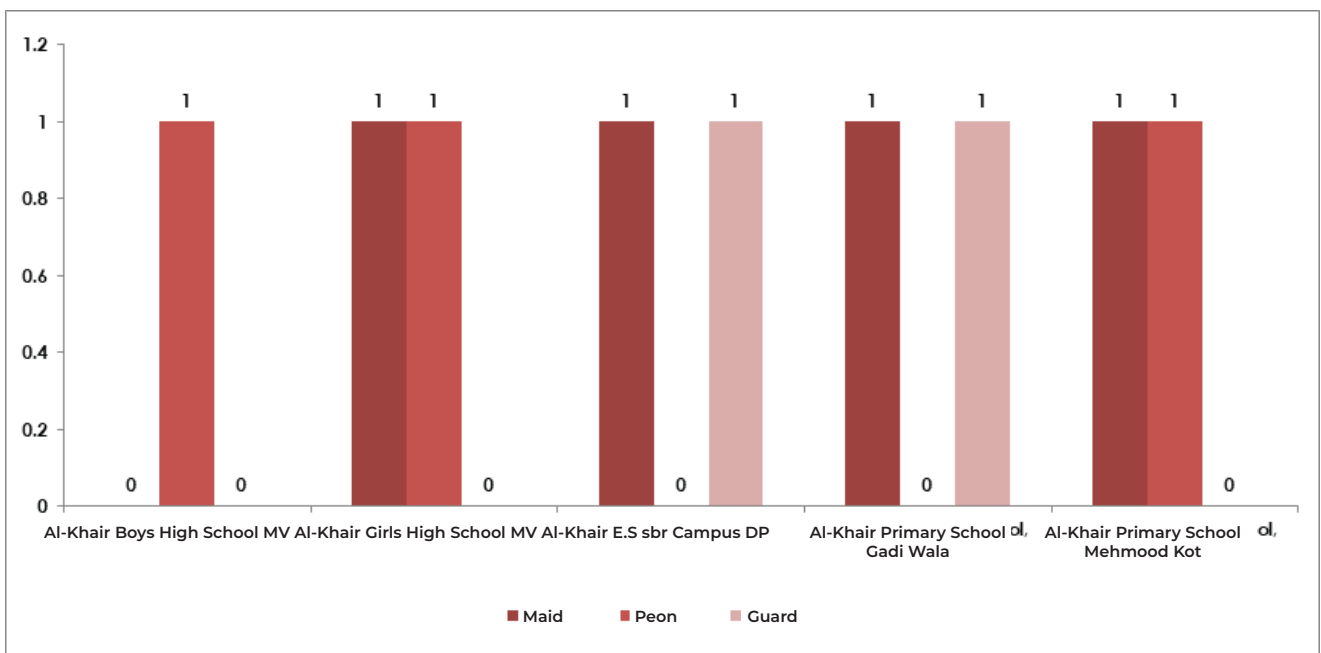
In light of these measures, PakAID, to have an immense intervention in the South Punjab Village of Kot Addu, for the betterment of people have been in contact with other stakeholders of Education. We have signed joint agreements with other stakeholders and are working closely for the uplift and renovation of schools and villages in general. These measures will not only help the students in their long term but also that the teachers will benefit. This will also create a general impact on the villagers and help to overcome the taboo attached to education and specifically education for females. In the long term, this will bring about wellbeing and uplift of the village at large. It is a slow process but when it's done, the benefits it will sprout are countless. Currently there are 45 teachers including 34 female teachers and 11 male teachers are getting directly benefited from PakAID education intervention (Graph-1.18). A total of 1075 students including girls and boys are continuing their education in 5 schools supported by PakAID along with 9 support staff (Graph-1.19 & 1.20). Details are in Annex-7.

PakAid is currently overlooking these orphanages in the region of Southern Punjab. Specifically it is working on the Education, both Quranic and Mainstream school education, of 200 orphans. Along with this, PakAID is providing for their food, clothing and shelter which are the constitutional rights of every child in Pakistan.

While providing for these, we loved the children's enthusiasm as they had a feeling of security and affection with all the basic necessities being provided to them.

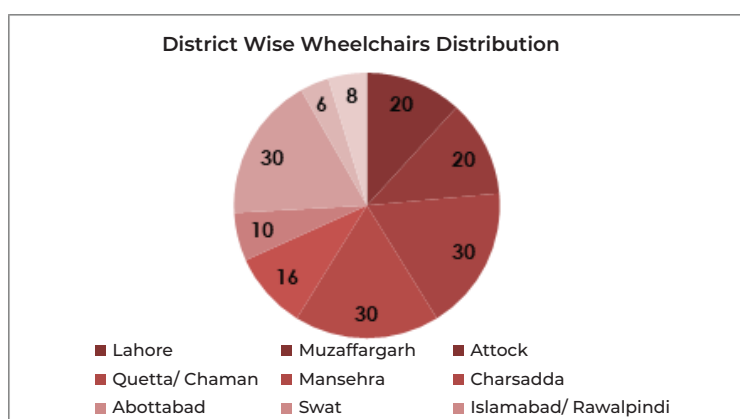

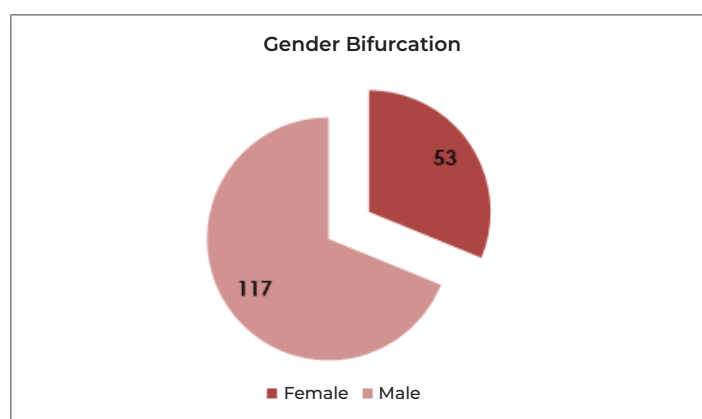
At PakAID with the kind and generous support of prestigious donors and PakAID-UK office initiated Healthcare and Nutrition Project which aims at providing medical assistance to the needy and specifically focusing on persons with physical limitations (PWPLs). Pakistan has a population of 0.48% of people with disabilities or persons with physical limitations (PWPLs). Among this population PakAID team is striving to assist people with physical disabilities such as locomotors disability which is the inability to move the limbs. Keeping in view the utmost need team at PakAID conducted raid need assessment to facilitate the individuals and facilitated by distribution 170 wheelchairs to the needy, deserving and most deprived ones across 14 districts of Punjab, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Balochistan and Azad Jammu & Kashmir. A total of 117 male and 53 female were facilitated during the distribution.

People with disabilities are looked down upon in our culture and they are faced with harsh challenges of life especially if they come from a very poor background. PakAID aim is to provide good quality wheelchairs to these people which will assist them in moving around help them develop an independent lifestyle. This will not only instill self-confidence in them but will also become a pathway for job opportunities to unfold in the economic sectors.

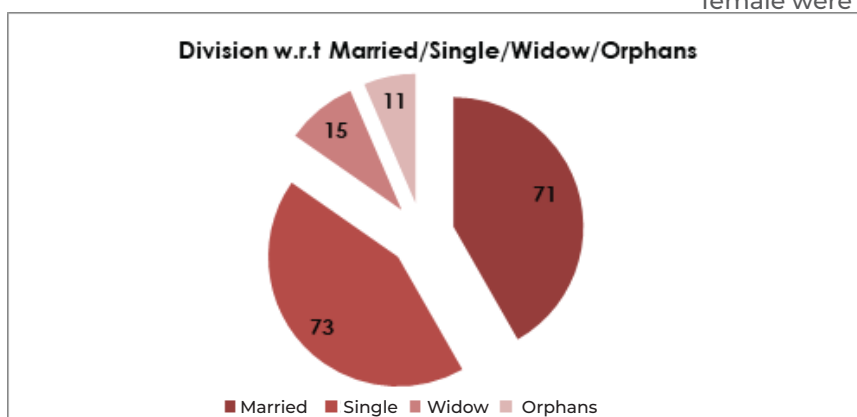
Day to day activities which are a struggle for them to complete can become easily doable by using a wheelchair. Basic hygiene and self-care functionality can be improved. It will assist them in presenting themselves as no less than other people in the society and help live a dignified life where they can be fully independent. Nousia Bibi, beneficiary of 2 bedroom house and wheel chair

“My name is Nousia and I am living in a village near Havelian. My 12-year old son is disabled since birth and I have to handle him with great difficulty. I have two daughters who are in prep and grade two. I was living a happy life in Karachi where I lived for 5 years. My husband moved to Saudi Arabia for work with all our savings but he died a month later. I received some amount after his death but by in-laws quarreled with me over the money and forced me to leave the house along with my children. Since then I have been living with my parents in their house which has two rooms. My married brother lives in one room whereas I, alongside my children, mother, father and a younger brother share the other single room. When it rains, water drips from the roof of our dilapidated house that has now become almost uninhabitable. Both of my brothers not only manage their own financial woes but they are also taking care of my children.

PakAID is building a house on the 5-marla land which my father has given to me. This house has two rooms a wash room and a courtyard. It is not possible to continue to live in the current house due to its dilapidated structure, we sincerely thank PakAID for helping us in our difficult time and we are grateful to them for building us a home to live. May Allah bless them for this deed and reward the donors of PakAID.”

“My name is Hafiz Noor Muhammad and I am a resident of village Padi. Back in January 1966, I came to this mosque for Imamate where I delivered sermon besides leading the prayers and also taught Qur’an for forty consecutive years. So far, 38 students have memorized the Holy Quran as a result of my hard work. Today they are teaching in famed institutions and are also running their own Madrassas as well.

My eyesight has now got very weak; therefore, I can only teach reading and reciting the Quran. The holy Quran has bold letters but still it is very difficult for me to read. Although I have memorized the Quran, it has become very difficult for me to read. I’m visually impaired and my legs are paralyzed due to which I cannot even stand. I cannot offer prayer while standing; instead I have to perform Salah while sitting. It’s not possible for me to attend funerals, weddings or to join someone in their joys and sorrows, just because I’m unable to engage myself in such social activities.

Alhamdulillah, PakAID has given me this wheelchair, now I will be able to interact with people, go to the market and greet my friends. May Allah grant more success and progress to this organization, may Allah bless them with honor and prosperity for taking care of the poor and needy like us. All I can do is pray, I have lived most of my life which is about to come to an end. I’m just passing my time but I’m highly grateful to PakAID for providing me with a wheelchair.”
